Dear ENERGY STAR® Computers Partner or Other Interested Party:

As discussed during the March 1st ENERGY STAR Computers webinar, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has executed a plan to address stakeholder concerns over entries in the Desktop and Notebook Dataset. EPA has worked with ITI over the past few weeks to review this feedback and revise portions of its dataset. A memorandum with the results of an updated EPA analysis of base TEC levels is attached to this email, while the revised Draft 1 dataset for Desktop and Notebook Computers may be downloaded at the following link:
